

On July 1, 1992, the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act went into effect requiring institutions receiving federal student aid funds to make available to prospective students information regarding graduation, retention, and attrition rates beginning in July of 1993. Successful outcomes of students' academic performance are measured by graduates, transfers, persisters, and those receiving a certificate.

Of the 155 baccalaureate level students who entered Alfred State College in the Fall 2002, 42 (27.10%) graduated within four years; 62 (40.00%) graduated within five years; 68 (43.87%) graduated within six years; 48 (30.96%) transferred to another SUNY institution without a degree; 13 (8.39%) transferred to a non-SUNY institution without a degree; 0 (0.00%) were still enrolled in the Fall of 2008. In summary, 129 of the 155 students (83.23%) who enrolled at Alfred State College in Fall of 2002 achieved a successful outcome.
