

COMMON APA CITATION EXAMPLES

One author: Cobb, M. (2007).

Multiple authors: List up to 6 authors by last names, followed by initials. Use an ampersand (&) instead of the word “and”:

Cobb, M., & Pollard, R. (2005).

Cobb, M., Pollard, R., Greil, A.L., & Yatani, C. (2006).

More than 6 authors: List first 6 authors then the phrase **et al.**

Editor or editors and *no author*: Lounsberry, G., & Foreman, J. (Eds.). (1999).

Editor or editors *with an author* (editor follows title of book)

Plath, S. (2000). *The unabridged journals* (K. V. Kukil, Ed.). New York: Anchor.

Basic format for books

Koser, K. (2007). *International migration: a very short introduction*.
New York: Oxford University Press.

Title is ***italicized*** (underlined if handwritten). Follow by place of publication and publisher. Citation is double spaced and indented as shown.

Material from an edited book (such as a reference book)

Benkart, P. (1980). Hungarians. In S. Thernstrom (Ed.), *Harvard encyclopedia of American ethnic groups* (pp. 462 – 471).
Cambridge: Harvard University Press.

Article from a library database

Bernstein, B. (2007). The Hungarians. *Physics Today*, 60 (5), 63-64. Retrieved February 15, 2008, from Academic Search Premier database.

Italicize title of publication and volume number. Add date of retrieval and database name.
