Abstract: The article discusses the impact of training and *motivation* on the attainment of hearing safety. According to the author, safety managers should ensure that *employees* understand the significance of wearing hearing protection devices to prevent hearing-related risks when exposed to hazardous noise. She asserts that group training offers a positive role in providing background on the how and why of hearing safety as well as reinforcing *corporate culture*. She likewise stresses the need to motivate *employees* in taking precautionary measures to reduce hearing risks.
