Subject: October 15 Statement Regarding Assault

Dear Alfred State College Community,

Early this morning, a student was assaulted and seriously injured while walking back onto our Alfred campus. A witness reported the incident resulting in University Police Officers responding within seconds to render aid and take the four suspects responsible, all non-students, into custody. The suspects, who face felony charges, were arraigned before a judge and remanded to the Allegany County Jail in lieu of bail. The investigation is ongoing and additional charges are pending.

Members of the college's administration are actively in contact with the family as we show support and solidarity for a member of our community. We recognize that any situation of violence is unsettling in our small campus community and village. Staff at Health and Wellness Services can provide support if you feel your own well-being is impacted. You can contact them at 607-687-4200 or by going to T.A. Parish Hall during open hours.

We are grateful to the witness for immediately reporting the incident and to University Police Officers for standing at the ready, both last night and as a normal service 24/7. You can partner in efforts to keep yourself and the Alfred community safe by following these steps:

- Have a phone ready, close at hand, to call police at 911 if confronted by aggression.
- Be vigilant watching for unknown persons following you onto campus.
- Travel in groups of two or more using the buddy system.
- Our residence halls are locked 24/7. Upon entering residence halls, make sure doors lock behind you and are never accidentally left ajar.
- Once in your room, make sure your door is locked.
- Report any suspicious persons or circumstances to University Police immediately 911 (emergencies) or 607-587-3999 (general #)
- While Alfred is a small tight-knit community, do not be complacent about your safety-here, or anywhere.

Our student did not deserve to be assaulted, and no form of violence is ever an acceptable response to anything for any reason. The perpetrators of this assault, like anyone who commits violence, will be held accountable in the criminal justice system.

Collectively, we stand in support of our student, who has been hospitalized and is receiving medical treatment, and support for their family. Out of respect for the family and to cooperate with the ongoing investigation, we are unable to share more information at this time, but we

appreciate your prayers to our student, family members, and others who have been impacted by this terrible incident.

Dear Students,

As we begin the weekend, I wanted to echo <u>President Mauro's sentiment</u> earlier this week that violence is *never* an appropriate response to anything for any reason. When you *see* something, you should*report* it. Please be reminded of the many safety resources available to you:

- A fully sworn police department on duty 24/7/365 who can be reached at 607-587-3999
- Approximately 15 emergency blue light phones to contact police headquarters
- Police are available to escort any student if they feel they are in an unsafe environment
- An anonymous web-based tip line at <u>www.alfredstate.edu/silent-witness</u> to provide a mechanism for individuals to report unsafe activity
- Locked residence halls 24/7 so only the residents from that building can enter
- A security camera system across multiple buildings and several outdoor locations
- Website with safety tips available to all members of our community at www.alfredstate.edu/safety-tips
- Every fall and spring semester, we offer <u>self-defense classes</u> for anyone interested and also offer the <u>RAD course</u> free of charge – contact UPD for more information

When we become aware of situations by report or video, not only will our police investigate but we will also use internal <u>student conduct</u> processes to ensure people who participate in violent or disorderly behavior are held accountable.

While this list above is extensive, the most important resource is you. As students, you will ultimately play a large role in shaping what the climate is like and how it feels on campus. Let's make it a positive one.

Subject: Student Altercation Oct. 24

Yesterday afternoon 10/24, students were reportedly involved in an incident that started on the highways between the Wellsville and Alfred campuses and culminated in an aggressive confrontation on the campus roadway that involved an edged weapon. The police quickly responded and based on the investigation, made an arrest for both assault and criminal mischief.

While the altercation thankfully didn't result in serious injury, we applied our interim suspension policy as described in our <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>. The investigation will continue, and the matter will advance in both the criminal justice system and student conduct process to determine individual accountability for those involved.

As President Mauro has clearly and unequivocally stated, violence is never an appropriate response. You can be a partner in campus safety by adhering to the following:

- Alert us. If you see something, summon the police to allow the fastest response 911 (emergencies) or 607-587-3999 (time-sensitive UPD direct line)
- Be accountable for your own actions; self-assess whether you are more interested in recording and uploading crudely or inaccurately captioned videos of incidents for likes/reactions, than being a responsible member of the community.
- Review the website with safety tips available to all members of our community at <u>www.alfredstate.edu/safety-tips</u>

Our University Police will be surging extra coverage over the next weeks to be both highly visible and available to students who feel more comfortable by the added levels of police. Our sense of community relies upon all of us collectively choosing to abide by a shared set of <u>Principles of Community</u>.

Violent behavior has NO place in our community, and we will continue to act swiftly to prevent, respond to, and use our internal student conduct and legal system to the fullest extent possible to remove anyone exhibiting violent behavior from our campus.

Subject: Halloween Fun and Safety

Dear Students,

This month has been particularly challenging for our community and Halloween offers many opportunities, including <u>College-sponsored events</u>, for us to focus on tradition and celebration. However, it remains important to be mindful of *everyone's* safety and to always demonstrate Pioneer Pride through our actions.

Each year, there is reporting in the national media on young adults who make poor choices with offensive costume choices or party themes which are then memorialized on social media. In some cases, these poor choices lead to changed or damaged futures. Do not encourage, promote, or participate in activities that are insensitive or contrary to your values, that could injure your good standing in the community, or that violate the College's Principles of Community and Student Code of Conduct.

Violence prevention has been and will continue to be a focus of the College during this and every season. One aspect of these efforts is to appropriately confront the promotion, trivialization, and glorification of violence on social media. Before posting, sharing, or commenting on this type of content, ask yourself whether your engagement is <u>anti</u>-violent. If you cannot readily identify the value in your contribution, please consider modifying or simply not posting the questionable material.

Sadly, it has also been observed that some members of our community have seemingly prioritized making content over the health and well-being of others. In one recent, widely shared video on Instagram, numerous individuals could be seen recording a physical altercation *yet there were no calls made to emergency services* at the time of occurrence. Everyone *should* get their phones out, if safe to do so when witnessing a public safety concern. However, the *first* action should always be to <u>call</u> for assistance (typically, 911).

Most social media hosts observe *community guidelines* that overlap with the Alfred State's own <u>Principles of Community</u> and <u>Student Code of Conduct</u>. You are invited to join in reporting posts or accounts that you believe violate a platform's policies. While most services offer a readily accessible option for reporting concerning social media content, you can also reference <u>this webpage</u> if you don't know how to initiate this process.
