Housing assignments for students entering in the fall semester will be sent mid-June.

It is mandatory that all full-time students live on campus unless they meet specific off-campus eligibility requirements. If a student wishes to live off-campus, they must fill out the Campus Housing Waiver application found under "Forms" on eRezLife.

RESIDENCE HALL STAFFING

Resident assistants (RA's) are student staff that are carefully selected and trained. RA's live within each residence hall with the residents of the building. Their roles include peer mentoring, programming, conflict mediation, and serving as a resource person and hall- and school-policy enforcer.

Each residence hall is supervised by a live-in Residential Professional who is responsible for everything that goes on in that building. Residential Professionals serve as liaisons between students, faculty, parents, and college administrative personnel.



The University Police Department regularly conducts programs to promote student safety.

SAFETY & SECURITY

Each residence hall is staffed 8 p.m. - 1 a.m. on weekdays, or until 3 a.m. on weekends. Guests, visitors, and building residents must sign in when entering any residence hall after 10 p.m.

All overnight visitors must be registered and have a card filled out by their student host. Visitation is limited to 72 hours in a 10-day period.

Periodic fire drills are conducted to ensure that systems are working and residents know the proper evacuation procedures.

The University Police Department is open 24 hours/day, 365 days/year. You can reach an officer from any campus phone (ext. 3999) or from the "blue lights" located on campus grounds.



LIFESTYLE CHOICES

RESIDENCE HALL DETAILS

Alfred State's 14 residence halls are located in three geographic areas of the campus. You can choose between suite- and corridor-style housing. Our residential facilities offer a variety of room layouts & styles, and are all designed to foster a safe, inclusive, and productive environment. Each is equipped with laundry facilities, comfortable television and study lounges, wireless access, and community kitchens.

Upper Campus MacKenzie Complex (North, South, East, & West)

The MacKenzie Complex is composed of suites in "rowhouses" and "towers." The complex is located across the street from the Orvis Activities Center which houses athletics.

Middle Campus Braddon Hall, Burdick Hall, Peet Hall, and Shults Hall

Middle campus residence halls offer corridor-style living for first-year students. All rooms open into a hallway, and each floor is divided into wings with lounges. Middle campus residence halls are closest to Central Dining Hall, the Student Leadership Center, and the academic buildings.

Lower Campus Getman, Main Gate A, Main Gate B, and Robinson/Champlin (R/C)

Main Gate A and B offer suite-style housing, and R/C and Getman offer corridor-style housing. These residence halls are close to Main Street and the Pioneer Center.

Apartment-Style Housing Townhouses and MacKenzie Commons Apartments

(Upper-class students only)

The Townhouse and MacKenzie Commons Apartments house 180 students in 31 apartment-style residences. Each offers accommodations including private bedrooms, a full kitchen, living room, and two bathrooms.

FIRST-YEAR HOUSING

These living areas provide an intentional approach to helping students transition into college. A mix of curricular and co-curricular opportunities plus enhanced access to campus resources (Health and Wellness Services, Student Engagement, and Living Learning Communities) provide new students an inclusive living environment.

BACCALAUREATE

Provides an opportunity for students in bachelor's programs to reside together.

LIVING & LEARNING COMMUNITIES

Get a jump on your college experience from your first day on campus by joining one of these unique experiences! Become a member of one of our Living and Learning Communities (LLC) and take the knowledge you are learning in the classroom and connect it with experiences outside the classroom. This will make you better prepared to tackle your college experience than other students!

GENDER INCLUSIVE HOUSING

This option allows individuals who are not the same gender, who may identify outside of the gender binary (male or female), who may be questioning aspects of their sexuality/gender, or who may be in the process (or completed) a gender transition, to live in an environment that is safe and supportive. This living space is open to the entire campus community and, is requested through an application process. Applicants are selected on a yearly basis by a committee dedicated to the oversight of that community.

QUIET STUDY

A quiet area to study and reside. Mandatory 24-hour quiet. Television and music are allowed at minimal and respectful noise levels.

SUBSTANCE FREE

Supports healthy living for students of all ages and their guests. Alcohol is prohibited at all times in these areas. Each student signs a contract pledging to remain substance free while living in this area.



PET-FRIENDLY RESIDENCE

Students may bring a family pet to live with them in selected areas on campus; dogs (under 40 pounds when fully grown), domestic cats, and rabbits. Pets must be registered before being brought to campus. Apply on eRezLife.

FAQ

How are room assignments made?

Regular housing selection begins on April 13 for all first-year students. Transfer students may begin the process the week of March 23. Housing assignments for students entering in the fall semester will be sent mid-June.

Are single rooms available?

Designated singles are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. There is an additional cost for singles. The opportunity to have a single room is very slim, especially for first-year students.

Am I able to stay over breaks?

You must complete the break housing application to determine eligibility. Watch Student Announce in the weeks prior to the scheduled break.

What if I have special housing needs?

You will be asked to provide medical documentation to our Accommodative Housing Committee. Students should fill out the Accommodative Housing Request form on eRezLife and attach the documents there. If approved and space is available, we will do our best to provide you with appropriate accommodations.

Is there special housing for first-year students?

Yes! Based on space availability first-year students may have the opportunity to select housing in another residence hall. Townhouses or MacKenzie Commons Apartments are reserved for upper-class students.

Where do I get my roommate's contact information?

View your housing assignment and roommate information on eRezLife under "Housing."

How are the rooms furnished?

All standard double rooms are furnished with two of each of the following: beds and mattresses (twin size, extra long), floor or ceiling lamps, dressers, closets or armoires, desks, and desk chairs.

Should we get renters' insurance?

Please check your homeowners' insurance policy to verify if belongings are covered. The college recommends students obtain renters' insurance if not covered under a homeowners' policy.

May I change my room assignment?

There is a period within the first two weeks of each semester when students may relocate (based on space availability) with the permission of the Assistant Director of College Housing. At the completion of the room change period, elective relocation ends.

Does the College offer a 21 and over lifestyle on campus?

Yes! Individual apartments/suites may apply for designation as an Over-21 accommodation. All residents must meet the required age designation at the time of application, approval is at the discretion of the Assistant Director of College Housing. Students residing in designated Over-21 accommodations may enjoy specific privileges accorded to that lifestyle option.



DINING SERVICES

The dining team at ACES (Auxiliary Campus Enterprises and Services, Inc.) works hard to deliver meal plan choices that fit every budget, appetite, and lifestyle. MEAL PLANS

Meal plans incorporate dining dollars (DD), functioning as debit accounts accepted at any dining location. All students living on-campus are required to select an on-campus meal plan. However, townhouse residents, MacKenzie Commons apartment residents, commuters, and non-residential students have the flexibility to choose any plan or opt for no plan.

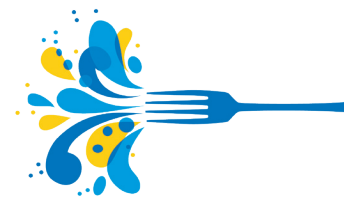
